The city of Suzu is located at the tip of the Noto peninsula. Suzu has developed its unique culture by the people who interacted frequently from the sea and the land. Suzu has been geographically isolated. That's why the traditional lifestyle and the customs have been remained in the city. Forgotten Japan is still there. The Oku-Noto Triennale 2017 will be held in autumn, the most vibrant time in Noto peninsula. That's because traditional Kiriko festivals will also be held then. It's the great encounter of the traditional culture and the contemporary art. This Triennale aims to stimulate untapped potentials of the place and create "foremost" culture from "furthest" place with participating artists from Japan and around abroad. KANAZAWA COLLEGE OF ART PROJECT TEAM "SUZUPRO" (JAPAN)

SUZUPRO consisting of teaching staff members and students across different disciplines was formed in preparation for Oku-Noto Triennale: Suzu 2017.

Under the theme "around calm ocean current", SUZUPRO will present artwork(s) featuring historical and social background to the development of the Japan sea and Suzu-city in an abandoned house in the iida area. In addition, SUZUPRO will organise collaborative projects with Kamikuromaru area. Since April 2016, SUZUPRO has launched fieldworks for a research and study focusing Oku-Noto culture with a perspective of Japan-sea rim. The outcome of the research has been presented at Cultural Typhoon at Tokyo University of the Arts in July 2016 and elsewhere. SUZUPRO has also been deepening the engagement with the local community through participation in local rituals (i.e. yobare) and festivals.



MAKI KIJIMA (JAPAN)

Born in 1976 in Tokyo. Studied at Oil Painting at Graduate School of Fine Arts, Tokyo University of the Arts. Under the theme of "reality and imagination" she creates artworks made by careful craftwork transforming usual objects such as pieces of cloth, plastic products into vivid plants and dresses. She ran series of workshops to engage local residents for creation of artworks for Echigo-Tsumari Art Triennale in 2009, 2012 and 2015.

She has being expanding her field of work through her involvement as an art producer for "Art Rink", an ice-skating rink set up in front of Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse in 2013 and running a workshop at Ichihara Lakeside Museum in 2014.



GYOKO YOSHIDA + KINOURA MEETING (JAPAN)

[GYOKO YOSHIDA]

Born in 1970 in Nagoya, Aichi. Completed her study at Graduate School of Tama Art University. She has explored the primitive structure of art in East Asia with particular focus on Japan and expressed differences in context between the east and the west. Although expressing media have been diverse, all of her artworks are within the field of Japanese painting. She received Asian Cultural Council grant and stayed in New York, USA in 2001 -2002 and returned to New York under "international studio & cultural programs" by Agency for Cultural Affairs, Japan in 2004-2005. She has presented artworks at many solo and group exhibitions including "Ima Kokoniaru Fukei" (2002/Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art), "Kaiga no Kozo · Jocho no Iso" (2001/Gallery Kuranuki, Osaka), and being a representing artist pf Japan at the 11th Triennale-India in 2005. Major publications include "GYOKO YOSHIDA 1993-2014 work & texts" (2014 BTAP / Tokyo Gallery) and "Pink Blood" (2001 Rikuyosha Co., Ltd.) She has been directing through engaging with longer-term projects to help develop younger artists from Hokkaido to Kyushu since 2005.

NOTO ABURI PROJECT (JAPAN)

Noto Aburi Project (NAP) was launched as an outcome of one of the life-long education classes for community building producer which was organised by Morning University of Marunouchi in summer 2013. NAP highlights charm of Oku-Noto by featuring diatomite cooking stove (called "shichi-rin" in Japan) and handmade charcoals(called "sumi" in japan), distinctive local products of Suzu-city as well as joy of aburi, charcoalgrilled cooking. NAP promotes special time and experience produced by aburi as it invites people to stay around the cooking stove as ingredients are slowly being cooked. Major activities include organising demonstration of aburi across Japan (2014), "Suzu Aburi Tour" collaborated with Suzu-city (2014), commercialising aburi kit (2014), and producing aburi kit as thanks token of furusato-tax contributors (2016) while promoting information relating to aburi through its official website.









BASURAMA-COLLECTIVE (SPAIN)

Basurama is an artist collective dedicated to research, cultural and environmental creation and production established in Madrid in 2001, whose practice revolves around the reflection of trash, waste and reuse in all its formats and possible meanings. They find gaps in contemporary processes of production and consumption that not only raise questions about the way we manage our resources but also about the way we think, they work, they perceive reality. Basurama acts like a creative linking platform where different agents of the same social network come together. It has created more than 100 projects in the four continents.









RIKUJI MAKABE (JAPAN)

Born in 1971 in Ishikawa. Graduated from Tama Art University. Currently based in Kanazawa. He sets out six key words to work under: life and death, nothingness and infinity, chaos and order. Expressing integration of wonder of nature and life beyond words with diverse cultures and value structures across the world through intuitive paintings.

OHJI YOSHINO (JAPAN)

Born in 1964 in Kagoshima. Graduated from Kyoto Seika University. He is a sculptor and professor at Kyoto Seika University. He has presented installations mainly using wooden sculptures but since his participation in Echigo-Tsumari Art Triennale 2009, he has put more focus on his own identity and site specificity. His allegorical works often feature farm animals and fish, suggesting farming and fishing are deeply rooted in the natural environment and climate of different regions and are in indispensable relations while humans are made existed as a part of such reproducible nature.
